The goal of this project is for the provider to meet compliance with the CMS HCBS final regulations by obtaining Person Centered Thinking training for staff within the agency. Project funds will be used for payment of wages for up to twenty five (25) staff to attend PCT training, curriculum materials for up to ninety (90) participants, and fees to pay for PCT Trainer Certification, and to maintain certification for up to two (2) years. PCT Training within the organization will promote client initiative, autonomy, and independence in making life choices, as well as facilitate individual choice regarding services and supports, and who provides them.

2019/2020	The Diane Cathey Center	\$29,366	HCBS Provider Development Funds
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The goal of this project is for the provider to meet compliance with the CMS HCBS final regulations by obtaining Person Centered Thinking training for staff, clients and their family members within the agency. Project funds will be used for payment of wages for up to ten (10) staff to attend PCT training, curriculum materials for up to ten (10) participants, and fees to pay for PCT Trainer Certification, and attendance stipends for clients and/or their family members. PCT Training within the organization will ensure individual's rights of privacy, dignity and respect, and freedom from coercion and restraint, as well as promote client initiative, autonomy, and independence in making life choices, and facilitate individual choice regarding services and supports, and who provides them.

2019/2020	New Dawn Support Services	\$25,166	HCBS Provider Development Funds
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The goal of this project is for the provider to meet compliance with the CMS HCBS final regulations by training and certifying up to four (4) individuals supported in facilitating People Planning Together. People Planning Together curriculum provides education to individuals supported in a peer to peer environment. Provider will offer People Planning Together training and education to individuals supported so that they are able to lead their own team while making independent life choices.

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The goal of this project is for the provider to meet compliance with the CMS HCBS final regulations by training and certifying 15 staff members in Association of Community Rehabilitation Educators (ACRE) Customized Employment. 5 staff members will also be funded to each receive 8 additional hours of on-line technical assistance/mentorship. The certified staff members will support adults eligible for Redwood Coast Regional Center Services through an individualized, person-centered process to achieve customized jobs. Customized Employment (CE) is a flexible process designed to personalize the employment relationship between a job seeker and an employer in a way that meets the needs of both.

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The goal of this project will be to develop a specialized residential care facility for the elderly (RCFE), licensed by Community Care Licensing, in Humboldt County. This home will offer a 4 bed specialized residential option for the elderly who have increasingly challenging support needs. The goal of this project will be to provide a licensed safe and supportive living environment for individuals over the age of 59. This service may support individuals who require

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increased medical, memory, and personal care supports. Some support needs may include diabetes management, special diets, regulating awake/sleep times, communication, skill enhancement/maintenance, and environmental adaptations.

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The goal of this project will be to develop a specialized residential care facility for the elderly (RCFE), licensed by Community Care Licensing, in Humboldt County. This home will offer a 4 bed specialized residential option for the elderly who have increasingly challenging support needs. This project will be to provide a licensed safe and supportive living environment for individuals over the age of 59. This service may support individuals who require increased medical, memory, and personal care supports. Some support needs may include diabetes management, special diets, regulating awake/sleep times, communication, skill enhancement/maintenance, and environmental adaptations.

2019/2020	Autism Services and Programs	\$20,000	Training/Consultation- CRDP
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The goal of this project is to provide train the trainer session/consultation for licensed counselors and behaviorists, using inclusive teen social skills groups to prevent and minimize the risk of sexual offending among teens with autism spectrum disorder. Trainings will consist of sessions, in the North and the South. This training is designed to teach participants how to establish and maintain their own teen social skills group for teens on the autism spectrum at risk for or who have already come in contact with the Juvenile Justice System as the result of sexual offending.

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The goal of this project is to provide Customized Employment Certification, focused on rural areas of Del Norte and Lake County. This project will provide trainings for up to 35 employment service professionals and other stakeholders to earn a Basic Employment Services with an emphasis in Customized Employment Certificate of Achievement from the Association of Community Rehabilitation Educators (ACRE). This project is to train educators and community service providers to increase the capacity to secure competitive integrative employment for people with disabilities.

The goal of the project will be to develop affordable housing options for individuals who receive RCRC services using the *Community Placement Plan Guidelines for Purchasing and Developing Permanent Housing* in Lake County. Rural Communities Housing Development Corporation has proposed new construction of an affordable multi-family housing complex in Lake County. This complex will be developed in accordance with Federal and State Housing laws that target individuals with developmental disabilities, senior households, and families. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the units will be set aside for use by RCRC clients only.

Ten of the 40 units (25%) will be set aside for use by RCRC clients only.
2017/2018	Ability Road	\$20,500	Social Security Advisor – HCBS-PDF The goal of this project will be for start-up activities and expenses to develop an in-house National Social Security Adviser to facilitate individual interactions with the Social Security Administration (SSA) and provide agency staff more information about how to present the actual work competencies of the individual to SSA.
2017/2018	Butler Valley – Carole Sund Center	\$150,000	Job and Education Developer – HCBS-PDF The goal of this project will be for start-up activities and expenses for a Job and Education Developer to support individuals served by the Carole Sund Center to develop self-advocacy skills, pursue college interests, and achieve competitive integrated employment.
2017/2018	Glen Haven Day Program	\$60,000	Purchase Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle – HCBS-PDF The goal of this project will be provide opportunities for people who use wheelchairs or other mobility assistance equipment to access a broader array of community activities and settings, by purchasing a wheelchair accessible vehicle for use by the service provider.

2017/2018	Parents & Friends, Inc.	\$386,893	Job Developer & PCT Training – HCBS-PDF The goal of this project will be for start-up activities and expenses for two projects: 1) Job Developer and purchase of Job Club class training materials and supplies, to promote and support an increased number of persons served to achieve competitive and integrated employment; 2) Person Centered Planning (PCP) training materials and supplies, certify and maintain two PCP certified staff trainers, train other staff, clients and community members to embrace and promote PCP principles and outcomes.
2017/2018	Diverse City Press	\$17,000	Training/Consultation- CPP The goal of this project will be to offer training and consultation to Supported Living Services (SLS) vendors, throughout RCRC's catchment area, regarding abuse prevention and reduction through the development of agency policy and

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protocols for care within SLS. Additionally, the training component will involve an abuse prevention class for people with disabilities who live in RCRC's catchment area, as well as provide training for vendors to offer this class in the future.

This contract will provide payment tracking and disbursement for venues as related to the trainings regarding abuse prevention and reduction through the development of agency policy and protocols for care within SLS, as provided by Dave Hingsburger of Diverse City Press.

2017/2018 RCHDC \$50,000 Housing Support Services- CPP

The project goal will be to develop and to assist in the acquisition of rental property in conjunction with the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) using the *Community Placement Plan Guidelines for Purchasing and Developing Permanent Housing*. The ultimate goal of the project will be to provide affordable housing options for individuals who receive RCRC services. The start-up funds will be used for project management and coalition development.

2017/2018 Gaddy Lane Elderly Enrichment \$50,000 Residential Development- CPP

The goal of this home will be to offer Community Care Licensed level 4i home for adults with intellectual disabilities and mental health support needs. The home will promote skill development for each resident in areas of self-regulation, communication, emotional expression, and effective coping strategies. The home will actively collaborate with mental and physical health services and other community agencies. Skill development, structure, and collaboration will be supported by a home whose staff are trained and motivated by the principles of Person Centered Thinking, Positive Behavior Supports, abuse prevention strategies and procedures for reporting abuse, mental health support needs, and Circles of Support.

2016/2017 People Services, Inc. \$114,443.30 Job Development and Employment Specialist– HCBS-PDF

The goal of this project will be for start-up activities and expenses for a Job Development and Employment Specialist to secure competitive and integrated employment for clients eligible for regional center services to meet the Federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) final regulations, or rules as per the 2016 Budget Act (SB826, Chapter 23, Statutes of 2016).

2016/2017 The Diane Cathey Center \$71,464 Community Integration – HCBS-PDF

The goal of this project is to promote employment first activities through developing a new staff position for an employment specialist, as well as supporting clients to create a greenhouse microbusiness. The Diane Cathey Center (DCC) will support clients to develop a microbusiness to operate out of a new greenhouse at the facility. The microbusiness will grow flowers and produce for sale to the community. Produce will also be used in the DCC cooking program and donated to the local food bank. The DCC will promote gainful employment by clients by hiring a staff person knowledgeable in successfully obtaining and training clients in all aspects of competitive integrated employment with local businesses.

2016/2017 The Ink People / Trajectory \$26,000 Community Integration – HCBS-PDF

The goal of this project will be to facilitate greater access to the community and inclusive activities for the people receiving services and bring people from the general community in to the Trajectory studio spaces to create art alongside those receiving services. This will be achieved through Trajectory's service to the community by offering individual and group storage where artwork can be left to dry safely. Upon installation of the kiln currently owned by Trajectory, the kiln will be made available to community members for use. Ink People/Trajectory will promote client access to community art activities by paying the fees for clients to: access community classes and workshops, access community

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studio time, become members of art associations and collectives, and submit their work to community, national, and international inclusive exhibitions. Fees will only be used for activities that occur in typical community art settings. Finally, Trajectory will also provide in-depth training to staff and clients on person-centered thinking and practices.

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The goal of this project will be to provide community trainings on Person Centered Thinking (PCT) and the Home and Community Based Services Final Rule. The trainings will be offered to staff, clients, and family members. New Dawn Support Services will develop two new PCT Trainers at the agency.
