State Capitol Tree Lighting Ceremony

The 92nd Annual California StateCapitol Tree Lighting Ceremony, graciously hosted by Governor Gavin Newsom, was a spectacular event marked by a heartwarming tradition. Each year, a child from a regional center joins the governor to illuminate the towering tree, symbolizing unity and celebration.

This longstanding tradition took on new dimensions this year as individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities from across California came together to craft unique ornaments. These ornaments, lovingly created, adorned a majestic 60-foot red fir tree, and the tradition expanded further to include 21 additional trees—one for each regional center.

Notably, the Lake/Mendocino Spanish-Speaking Parent Support Group, "Lagrimas y Risas," and The Art Explorers in Fort Bragg, played a pivotal role. Collaborating with their children, they poured creativity and meaning into handmade ornaments, each bearing the names of their little artists. These heartfelt creations were sent to Sacramento, adorning both the grand 60-foot tree and a 7-foot RCRC Christmas.

On the day of the event, representatives from the 21 regional centers, led by DDS staff, came together to decorate the trees. The highlight of the ceremony was Governor Gavin Newsom, joined by his family and a five-year-old Native American child who is also a Regional Center client, lighting the trees. Following this magical moment, **Governor Newsom** took a stroll, visiting all 21 Regional Center trees and learning about the collaborative efforts of regional center clients, their families, staff, and vendors that made this ceremony possi-


