

Redwood Coast Regional Center Contract Awards FY 2011/2012

2011/2012 The Community Circle \$25, 000 Training/Consultation- Psychiatric-CPP

This is a one-time training and consultative service. The goal is to enhance current psychiatric services within our four-county area. The funds will provide medical professionals (physicians and mental health practitioners) specialized education, training, and information on mental and physical health issues, and how they interact with one another.

2011/2012 Augmentative Communication, Inc. \$18,170.58 Training/Consultation- Communication- CPP

This is a one-time training and consultative service. The goal of this project will focus on alternative communication methods and techniques. This project will provide AAC assessments for eligible RCRC clients; training opportunities for family members, vendors, and community-based services in the development of augmentative communication strategies; and an AAC technology fair in Eureka and Ukiah.

2011/2012 Independent Adult Services \$6,829.42 Training- Communication- CPP

Provided payment coordination, tracking, and funds disbursement for Augmentative Communication Training.

2011/2012 IECP \$50,000 SLS with a Mental Health Component- CPP

This will be a new service. The goal of this service is to support clients with intensive mental health and/or behavioral support needs. The grant request will support start-up costs for necessary mental health and behavioral supports (i.e. intensive training and collaboration with local public agencies), and other components necessary for start-up (i.e. office space, program development, etc.).

2011/2012 NCD, Inc. \$85,000 Adult Residential- Mental Health- CPP

This project has been discontinued.

This will be a new service. This service will offer a long-term specialized residential option for adults with a dual diagnosis and/or intensive behavioral support needs. The grant request will support start-up costs for necessary mental health and behavioral supports (i.e. intensive training and collaboration with local public agencies), and general costs associated with program development.
