

Redwood Coast Regional Center Contract Awards FY 2020/2021

2020/2021 Cider House \$55,000 Vehicle – HCBS

Purchase of a vehicle for use by clients in need of accessible transportation to promote client choices and opportunities for community based activities and bring agency into compliance with the Home & Community Based Settings Final Rule.

2020/2021 New Choices \$55,000 Vehicle – HCBS

Purchase of a vehicle for use by clients in need of accessible transportation to promote client choices and opportunities for community based activities and bring agency into compliance with the Home & Community Based Settings Final Rule.

2020/2021 Northern Humboldt Employment Services \$38,367 Vehicles – HCBS

Purchase of vehicles for use by clients in need of accessible transportation to promote opportunities for more independent employment and bring agency into compliance with the Home & Community Based Settings Final Rule.

2020/2021 Reaching For Independence \$242,500 Vehicles – HCBS

Purchase of up to ten (10) vehicles for use by clients in need of accessible transportation to promote client choices and opportunities for community based activities and bring agency into compliance with the Home & Community Based Settings Final Rule.

2020/2021 Turning Point of Central California, Inc. \$44,424 Person Centered Thinking Training – HCBS

Funding for training and staff positions that help to implement sustainable person-centered practices within the service and bring the agency into compliance with the Home & Community Based Settings Final Rule.

2020/2021 Redwood Community Services \$100,000 Foster Family Agency for Children- CRDP

Development of a Foster Family Agency for children, licensed with Community Care Licensing in Humboldt County. This will be a new service. The total grant request is \$100,000. This service will provide children the opportunity to live in a family environment long-term or as a crisis bed option. The Start-up funding will be used to recruit specialized families, training, and meet the CCL FFA certification process. This service will be licensed under the foster family regulations and will support children whose families can no longer support their children in their own homes.

2020/2021 People Services, Inc. \$125,000 Disaster Preparedness- CRDP

This service will be developed in Lake County. This service will provide a safe site based or mobile location for RCRC clients during State and local emergencies such as fires, inclement weather, and power shut-offs. These centers will be developed and available for the clients who have been identified as the most vulnerable during disasters such as homeless populations and those receiving minimal support services. Services will be provided during disasters to serve as a safe environment and a point of contact for RCRC clients to access food, housing/shelter resources, medical equipment/phone charging, medication assistance, cooling and heating, and other support needs identified for each individual served. Funds may also be used to purchase technology such as laptops, notebooks, or Kindles so that individuals can stay connected with their families and other supports during closures due to Covid-19 or other natural disasters.
