

Redwood Coast Regional Center Contract Awards FY 2021/2022

2021/2022 Humboldt Community & Access Resource Center \$40,000 Jump Start to Self Determination - Self Determination Supports

The purpose of this service is to support people as they transition into Self-Determination at RCRC, to increase the diversity of people participating in Self-Determination, and to assist currently underserved people to access Self-Determination for needed services and supports.

2021/2022 HCAR – Bay Center \$375,555 Person Centered Practices, Vehicles, Employment - HCBS

The goal for this project is for HCAR Bay Center to transition into full compliance with the Home & Community Based Settings Final Rule through: training that helps to implement sustainable person-centered practices at the program, and for vehicles to increase opportunities for clients in need of accessible transportation. May also be used for staff to increase knowledge/implementation of person-centered practices at the Bay Center and to increase opportunities for community engagement and employment.

2021/2022 Nyumbani, LLC. \$35,000 Residential Services (Cont. FY 18/19) – CRDP

The goal of this project will be to provide a licensed safe and medically supportive living environment for adults aged 18-59 with complex medical needs. This service may support individuals who require intermittent catheterization, restricted healthcare plans, diabetes management, suctioning, and support for health challenges. The continuation grant request will provide additional funding for development costs related to environmental adaptations for the home.

2021/2022 Brilliant Corners \$650,000 HDO for EBSH Development- CRDP

The goal of this project is to purchase and renovate a 4 bedroom single-family home to be utilized as an Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) for adults in Humboldt County.

2021/2022 Finance for People \$242,409 Administration of RCRC Spending Plan for HCBS

The goal of this project is for the service provider to administer the RCRC HCBS Provider Develop Funds according to the RCRC Spending Plan and as determined by the RCRC Realizing Interdependent Success & Empowerment (RISE) Client Leadership Team. The following subcontracts have been awarded by RISE:

2021/2022 Ink People, Inc. / Trajectory \$40,500 Self-Advocacy Theatre Troupe

The purpose of this project is to engage individuals served by RCRC to develop an inclusive theatre troupe based in Humboldt County to teach people through performance, about their rights and empower them to speak up for themselves and others. Contractor will teach people the skills for self-advocacy and sexual self-advocacy.

2021/2022 Cycadian Health Advocacy \$11,265 Health Care Self-Advocacy Training

The purpose of this project is to engage individuals served by RCRC to provide Health Care Self-Advocacy training.

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2021/2022 Kate Jamison-Alward \$41,400 Sex. Ed. Social Group and Peer Educator Training

The purpose of this project is to engage individuals served by RCRC to provide a Sexual Education Social Group (for people ages 18-25 years) and Peer Educator Training (for people ages 18 years and older).

2021/2022 TransCen, Inc. \$22,609 Family Engagement Training & Train-the Trainer

The purpose of this project is to provide three (3) family engagement trainings to individuals served by RCRC and their families to promote Employment First. Trainings will take place in Del Norte, Lake, and Mendocino Counties. Contractor will also provide two (2) train the trainer trainings to professionals in Del Norte & Mendocino Counties.

2021/2022 Reaching For Independence \$71,500 Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle

Purchase of a wheelchair accessible vehicle for use by clients who want to be trainers in the Peer Advocacy Service.

2021/2022 Leah Thompson \$9,876 Support for HCBS Client-Led Focus Groups

The purpose of this project is to develop curriculum and training for RCRC clients to learn how to lead focus groups with other clients receiving HCBS services in settings requiring on site assessment for the HCBS Final Rule implementation. Additionally, contractor provided logistical support to client-led focus groups in Humboldt County.

2021/2022 Brie Handl \$8,295 Supplies for Medical Training for Direct Support Staff

The purpose of this project is to purchase supplies needed for medical training to be offered to direct support staff so that clients with high medical support needs would have choice of settings in which to reside, including in their own home.

2021/2022 Ink People, Inc. / Trajectory \$41,700 Support RCRC RISE Client Leadership Team – HCBS

The goal of this project is for service provider to support the Realizing Interdependent Success & Empowerment (RISE) Client Leadership Team and Client Advocate facilitators as they work together to learn about HCBS and self-advocacy, research and develop curriculum, facilitate discussions, lead workshops, use technology, and determine other projects that they would like to carry out. The provider will also offer support by connecting with team members to ensure they have the appropriate technology, support, and that their needs are met to participate prior to meeting.

2021/2022 Young Adult Institute \$170,000 Service Provider EBSH (Cont. FY 20/21) – CRDP

Development of an Enhanced Behavioral Support Home for children, licensed as a "Group Home" by Community Care Licensing (CCL) for (4) children. The home will serve children with intellectual/developmental disabilities, autism spectrum disorder and mental health support needs. These children have intensive behavioral support needs, who have been identified through RCRC's unmet needs and CPP/CRDP process. The age range of children served will be 11 - 17 years old. The home will provide a person centered, positive behavior supportive and therapeutic community living environment for children and adolescents who have not had adequate support to remain in their family homes and/or in other licensed living arrangements in the community.
