Disability Pride is a Community Effort

At RCRC, we love to celebrate people and families who use our services, and also the power of working together. Disability Pride month this year was a great example.

In addition to the Lakeport event, there were four other events in our catchment area at the same time — Crescent City, Eureka, Ukiah, and Fort Bragg. All of these events had different planning teams! That means that in total, more than 500 people went to Disability Pride events in our area this year, and probably more than 100 people helped make them happen by planning them or tabling or being an interpreter, which feels really special to me.

All of the events were different. They were different in the ways that local people shared what they were interested in, like in Ukiah there was a music festival. In Crescent City there were fire dancers and hot dogs. In Eureka this year there was speed friending. What do you like to do,

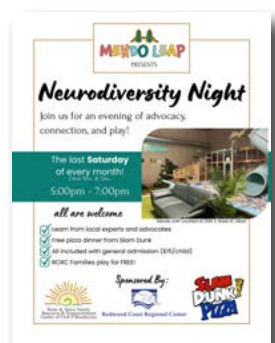

DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES (DDS)

Family Outcomes Survey

Each year the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) invites a randomly selected group of families who are currently participating in or have previously participated in the Early Start Program to take part in the Family Outcomes Survey (FOS). DDS will be sending the annual survey to thousands of families statewide on August 5, 2026 that will run through October 30, 2026.

Families will have the option to complete a paper-based survey, or an online survey through a website. In addition to a paper or online survey, a QR code will be provided so families can access the survey on their smartphones. The letter and paper survey are in English

and Spanish. The online and QR code-linked survey is available in simplified and traditional Chinese, English, Farsi, Hmong, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese.

The survey asks for some information about the family, including their child's birth date. All responses are kept anonymous and only are used after combining individual responses with other families' responses. If families need support completing the survey, they can reach out to the Service Coordinator for assistance.

WHY AAC?	
	"AAC (Augmentative and Alternative Communication) means all of the ways that someone communicates besides talking. People of all ages can use AAC if they have trouble with speech or language skills. Augmentative means to add to someone's speech. Alternative means to be used instead of speech." (American Speech-Language Hearing Association)
	AAC can benefit anyone who has difficulty communicating or being understood for: • one or more functions of communication and/or • in one or more environments and/or • with one or more communication partners
	AAC supports communication functions such as: • requesting • commenting • asking/answering questions • protesting • directing • expressing feelings • gaining attention • greetings/farewells • social bonding • negotiating • and more!
	How can AAC help? AAC is a tool to more fully realize a person's right to communicate, to actively participate, and to connect with those around them. A person can use many different types of AAC based on their needs (lite tech, mid tech, high tech, signing, writing, and more).
	The main goals of AAC are: • Successful communication • Autonomy • Self-Determination • CONNECTION with others
