Redwood Coast Regional Center Fiscal Year 2013-14 Purchase of Service Expenditure Data Charts

In 2012 AB 1472 added Section 4519.5 to the Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC), which is a part of the WIC referred to as the Lanterman Act. These provisions became effective January 1, 2013 and in summary, provide for the following:

- The Department of Developmental Services (DDS) and the Regional Centers shall annually compile data relating to purchase of service (POS) authorization, utilization, and expenditure by each Regional Center with respect to all of the following:
 - The age of client,
 - Race or ethnicity of the client,
 - o Primary language spoken by the client, and
 - Disability detail.
- The data reported shall also include the number and percentage of individuals, categorized by age, race or ethnicity, and disability, who have been determined to be eligible for Regional Center services but are not receiving purchase of service funds.
- By March 31, 2013, each Regional Center shall post this POS data on its internet web site. Commencing on December 31, 2013, each Regional Center shall annually post this data by December 31.
- Within three months of compiling the POS data, and annually thereafter, each
 Regional Center shall meet with stakeholders in a public meeting regarding the data.

In 2014 SB 1093 revised WIC Section 4519.5 effective January 1, 2015 to further add the following provisions:

- Regional Centers shall maintain previous years' POS data on their websites.
- Regional Centers shall hold public meetings related to this POS data separately from Regional Center board meetings.
- Regional Centers shall provide participants of the public meetings with the POS data and any associated information, with discussion in a manner that is culturally and linguistically appropriate for that community, including providing alternative communication services.
- Regional Centers shall consider the language needs of the community and schedule the meetings at times and locations designed to result in a high turnout by the public and underserved communities.
- Regional Centers shall annually report to DDS by April 1st each year regarding its implementation of the requirements of WIC section 4519.5, with Regional Centers and the Department annually posting these reports on their respective websites by August 31.

In response to the above mandates, RCRC has posted its POS Expenditure Data for the last three fiscal years on its website, which can be found at http://redwoodcoastrc.org/transparency/purchase-of-services-pos-expenditure-data. For fiscal year 2013-2014 this data includes 20 tables of information that fall into three categories: Services, No Services and Insurance. Data in all three categories are further broken down by diagnosis, ethnicity or race, language and residence.

In an effort to help present this data in a more user-friendly format, RCRC has created the following graphs, which are based on the data in the tables for the 2013-2014 fiscal year.

Limitations of the Purchase Of Service Expenditure Data

Purchase of Service Costs

The POS data displayed represents the cost of services that clients received that are paid for by the Regional Center. This POS expenditure data does not include the cost of services clients receive that are paid for by Supplemental Security Income, Medi-Cal, the school system, and other generic agencies. Nor does it include funds paid by the Regional Center "under contract" for clients or the cost of case management services provided by the Regional Center. For the 2013-14 fiscal year the Regional Center may still make payments for services provided to clients for FY 2013-14 up until June 2017.

Client Count

The total number of clients who received services during the fiscal year will be greater than the Regional Center's actual caseload. A client is included in the data if the client received a Regional Center funded service at any time during the fiscal year. A Client who received a single service once during the year is counted the same as a client who received ongoing monthly services. The client is also counted regardless of their current status with the Regional Center. The data may include clients whose current status is closed, transferred-out, in-active, etc.

Authorized Services

Services that are authorized "encumber" funds needed to pay for those services. For a number of reasons, authorized services will always be more than what is actually paid for services. In many cases authorizations are written for the maximum amount of services that *may* be needed, with the knowledge that if less services are actually needed, less services will be provided.

Definitions

Definitions for the following are provided in the NOTES section of this report:

- Diagnosis
- Ethnicity
- Language

Age

Each client's age is determined as of January 1 of the report year. So if a client turned 22 on March 14, 2014, all of their expenditures would be included in the 3 years to 21 years group.

Residence Code

On the expenditures by residence code, a client's expenditures will show up in the residence code that they had as of June 30, 2014. So, if a client lived in a Community Care Facility most of the year and then was admitted to a Developmental Center in May 2014, all of their expenses would show up under the Developmental Center residence code.


Insurance Co-Payments

This year Regional Centers were required to report POS expenditure data for insurance co-payments and co-insurance for clients by ethnicity. This subset of the total POS expenditures only includes POS expenditure data for those clients that are covered by health insurance. According to state and national estimates, some ethnicities are more likely to have insurance than others. 75.2% of Asians are likely to have health insurance, whereas 53.8% of Black/African Americans and 44.9% of Hispanics are likely to have health insurance, while Whites have a 76.0% likelihood of having health insurance. Most of the health insurance co-pay and co-insurance expenditures statewide for Regional Center clients are for minors with autism who receive behavioral supports and services. This is the case for RCRC: There was only one client who had POS expenses related to insurance co-payments. The client is a white, English speaking minor with Autism, living at home and who received behavioral-related services.

PRIMARY ETHNICITY OF RCRC AND STATEWIDE POPULATIONS, FISCAL YEAR 2013-14









RCRC PER PERSON EXPENDITURES BY PRIMARY LANGUAGE & AGE, FISCAL YEAR 2013-14







RCRC PER PERSON EXPENDITURES BY PRIMARY DIAGNOSIS AND AGE, FISCAL YEAR 2013-14











NO SERVICES BY PRIMARY ETHNICITY OF RCRC AND STATEWIDE POPULATIONS, FISCAL YEAR 2013-14






NO SERVICES BY PRIMARY DIAGNOSIS AND RESIDENCE, FISCAL YEAR 2013-14



6 Diagnosis Defintions:

- Autism Any client with a diagnosis of Autism, regardless of any other diagnosis that the client may also have.
- Intellectual Disability Any client with a diagnosis of Intellectual Disability who **does** not also have a diagnosis of Autism, but may also have a diagnosis of Cerebral Palsy, Epilepsy, Category 5, and/or Other.
- Cerebral Palsy Any client with a diagnosis of Cerebral Palsy who **does not** also have a diagnosis of Autism and/or Intellectual Disability but may also have a diagnosis of Epilepsy, Category 5, and/or Other.
- Epilepsy Any client with a diagnosis of Epilepsy who does not also have a diagnosis of Autism, Intellectual Disability, and/or Cerebral Palsy but may also have Category 5, and/or Other.
- Category 5 Any client with a diagnosis of Category 5 who **does not** also have a diagnosis of Autism, Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy, and/or Epilepsy but may also have a diagnosis of Other. Note: Clients listed in Category 5, according to WIC Section 4512, are individuals who have "disabling conditions found to be closely related to Intellectual Disability or to require treatment similar to that required for individuals with Intellectual Disability, but shall not include other handicapping conditions that are solely physical in nature."
- Other Any client with a diagnosis of Other who **did not** also have a diagnosis of Autism, Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy, Epilepsy, and/or Category 5. This includes clients that have been determined to have "no diagnosis."
