Number and percent of minors residing with families	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to develop out-of-home respite options for families in Del Norte, Lake, Mendocino, and Humboldt Counties</li> </ul>
Number and percent of adults residing in independent living	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to offer self advocacy supports to interested adults.</li> <li>• Promote Individual Support Plans which offer skills training toward independence for persons served.</li> </ul>

Number and percent of adults residing in family homes (home of parent or guardian)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide more information to individuals and families about available generic and community resources.</li> </ul>
Number and percent of minors living in facilities serving >6 (Desired outcome = less)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Focus on the development of new licensed residential homes, that are smaller homes, with specialized supports where needed.</li> </ul>
Number and percent of adults living in facilities serving >6 (Desired outcome = less)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to encourage development of smaller licensed residential homes, with individual bedrooms where possible, and offering specialized services when needed.</li> <li>• Continue working through Community Placement Plan (CPP) to address need for affordable housing options.</li> </ul>

Individuals/families requesting Positive Behavioral Support services will begin receiving services within 30 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to expand number of training options for families receiving behavioral support services.</li> </ul>
Individuals/families will receive information on services from RCRC at least twice yearly	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to use simple, user-friendly formats and language when developing materials.</li> </ul>
Adults in RCRC four-county area who: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Earn income</li> <li>• Participate in supported employment</li> <li>• Participate in competitive employment</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to provide individuals with information on work opportunities, such as supported employment, customized employment and micro-enterprise.</li> <li>• Continue to provide training and technical assistance for existing adult day service providers on <i>Employment First</i> and ways to implement new employment strategies. (“<i>Employment First</i>” means having a conversation about employment as the <i>first</i> of all available options.)</li> <li>• Provide information about transition and adult services for families of school-aged children.</li> </ul>
Children and adults have access to medical and dental services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to work with Department of Developmental Services to implement strategies for access to medical/dental services, given changes to California Medi-Cal coverage.</li> <li>• Provide a user friendly guide to various services available through Medi-Cal and post on web site.</li> </ul>
Number of consumers per thousand who are victims of abuse	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to coordinate abuse prevention activities with law enforcement and first responders.</li> <li>• Develop guidelines for recognition of ways clients may communicate that they have been a victim of abuse.</li> </ul>
